APPENDIX A HOW TO REQUEST CHANGES TO THESE RULES AND GUIDELINES

Requests for changes to this booklet will be processed in the following manner:

1. Any person desiring corrections, additions, or other changes should send a written description of those items to:

Written requests for corrections, additions, or other changes will also be accepted at any time by any member of AKA's Kitemakers' Competitions Committee.

- 2. Proposed changes will be reviewed and debated by the Committee. In certain circumstances, the Committee may submit proposed changes to AKA's Board of Directors.
- 3. If a proposed change is accepted and will result in a change to this rulebook, the Committee will determine when that change will be implemented. Efforts will be made to ensure that any changes implemented will not negatively affect competitors or established competitions.
- 4. Approved changes will be printed as Committee memoranda which will be printed in *Kiting* and distributed with copies of the rulebook, except in the case of changes which create major procedural or organizational changes. In such cases, AKA will print a new rulebook. Memoranda describing rulebook changes will be numbered and indexed so as to indicate to which edition of the rulebook each memorandum applies.
- 5. This rulebook will be reprinted on an as-needed basis. In the interim, the most recent rulebook plus all numbered memoranda shall be considered to be the official rulebook. Where there is conflicting information, the most recent memorandum shall take precedence over information provided in the rulebook.

APPENDIX B SAMPLE REGISTRATION FORM

The Registration Form should reflect information about the competitor, the categories they are entering, and some history of the contestant for the announcer. This information can be used during the event and also as reference material for publications such as magazines or newsletters.

APPENDIX E SAMPLE SCORESHEETS If computerized scoring is not used, there will be one Scoresheet for each competitive kite category. This Scoresheet will show the average scores for each kite for each judging criterion: Flight, Visual Appeal, Craftsmanship, and Structural Design, plus the sum of these four scores, which is the Overall Total Score. A Scorekeeper will record the average criteria scores of all competitors in that kite category on this one sheet. The scores for another kite category will be recorded on another sheet, and so on.
